It hasn't always been this way. In the 4th century AD a heresy (now referred to as Replacement Theology) crept into the Church, influenced by the very anti-Semitic Greek and Roman cultures. remove the Jewish origins of the Bible. Nowadays it sounds almost laughable that



such a lie could be believed. After all, the 39 books of the Old Testament and the 27 books of the New Testament were written by Jewish Prophets and Apostles under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, Yeshua (Jesus), the Son of God, came into the world as a Jewish Messiah, fulfilling every Jewish prophesy, to offer Himself as the once and for all perfect sacrifice for the sins of the world.

Replacement Theology states that all of God's promises and covenants ascribed to the people and land of Israel, are now null and void, and only apply to the Church. Of course, to believe this, would mean that God Himself can no longer be trusted, because He would be a covenant-breaking God!

The Truth is, Christians should have a heart for Israel because God LOVES Israel!

"The LORD did not set His love on you nor choose you because you were more in number than any other people, for you were the least of all peoples; but because the LORD loves you, and because He would keep the oath which He swore to your fathers[.]" --Deuteronomy 7:7-8a (NKJV)

"But Zion said, 'The LORD has forsaken me, the Lord has forgotten me.' Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you! See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands..." -- Isaiah 49:14-16 (NIV)

Christians should have a heart for Israel because God has an eternal covenant with the Land.

Speaking to Abraham, God said: "I am giving all this land, as far as you can see, to you and your descendants as a permanent possession." - Genesis 13:15 (NLT)

Regarding the nations throughout history who have tried to annihilate the Jews and take their land, God says: "And I will enter into judgment with them there on account of My people, My heritage Israel, Whom they have scattered among the nations; They have also divided up My land." -- Joel 3:2 (NKJV)

The Apostle Paul writes: "I am not ashamed of the Good News, because it is the power God uses to save everyone who believes-to save the Jews first, and then to save non-Jews." -- Romans 1:16 (NCV)

Paul writes: "I want you to understand this mystery, dear brothers and sisters, so that you will not feel proud about yourselves. Some of the people of Israel have hard hearts, but this will last only until the full number of Gentiles comes to Christ. ²⁶ And so all Israel will be saved."

"Many of the people of Israel are now enemies of the Good News, and this benefits you Gentiles. Yet they are still the people He loves because he chose their ancestors Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob." -- Romans 11: 25-26a,28 (NLT)

Greenland is a sparsely populated, ice-covered, remote island nation made up of 56,000 Inuit people. They are a rugged people, living in arguably one of the harshest climates on earth. Greenland has been receiving a lot of attention in the news lately for its wealth of natural resources and geopolitically strategic location.

The first missionary to bring the Gospel to Greenland 1,000 years ago, was a woman named Thjodhild. She was the Christian wife of Norse explorer Erik the Red. Thjodjild had accepted Jesus while in Iceland, through the ministry of a German missionary named Bishop Friedrich. Though there is no record of her famous husband, Erik, receiving Jesus, her strong faith led her to plant the first church in Greenland, meeting the spiritual needs of the 300 Norse familes who had settled the southwestern coastal region.



Later, in the early 1700s, missionaries from Herrnhut, Germany arrived and translated the Bible into the language of the Inuits. At there was resistance. but when they learned of the

suffering that Jesus experienced on the Cross, their hearts melted and the Gospel spread throughout the coastal villages! What a story!

In June, I (Dan) had the honor of teaching at New Life Church, in the capitol city of Nuuk (pop 20,000), on several topics, culminating in a marriage seminar! It was a great time! New Life Church owns one of the few radio stations in the country, and broadcasts into 15 other remote towns. All of the messages were recorded and have been rebroadcast several times! Glory to God! We are believing for much Fruit!
